HE IS RISEN INDEED!

The United States is one of the few countries in which the customary Easter greeting contains no reference to the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Throughout the Greek-speaking world, for example, Christians address one another in the same Easter salutation that rang through the early Church, "Christos anestee!" "Christ is risen!" and with the ancient response, "Aleethinos anestee," "He is truly risen!" In the Latin Church of the first centuries, the Easter greeting was, "Vivit!" "He lives!" and the reply, "Vere vivit!" "He lives indeed!" In Spanish lands, Christians say, "Cristo vive!" In Germany, believers salute one another with exultant joy: "Der Herr ist auferstanden!" and the reply, "Er ist wahrhaftig auferstanden!" Even in Russia, they say "Christos Voskres!" and receive the reply, "Voistinu Voskres!" All glory to the risen Christ!
