C: Pity all prisoners and loose the bonds of their sins.

C: Uphold those who are weakened by past sins.

C: Rebuke the storms of passion and anger and bid the waves be still.

L: You who did make both the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak:

C: Open deaf ears to Your message and loosen stammering tongues to speak words of patience.

L: You who did put to shame the woman of Samaria:

C: Reveal to many who are living in sin the shame of their life, and bring them to repentance.

C: Quicken dead souls to the life of righteousness.

C: Save, O Lord, those who put their trust in You.
