PROMINENCE OF CHRIST'S ASCENSION IN APOSTLES' CREED

The Creed devotes only one comma to the entire public ministry of Jesus. There is nothing in that Creed between the virgin birth of Jesus and His suffering under Pontius Pilate except a comma. And yet two whole lines are devoted to the Ascension. "He ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty, from thence He will come to judge the living and the dead."
