Rev. Dr. James Marriott, Organ

Dr. James Marriott is the Kreft Chair for Music Arts and director of Music Arts at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis.

An Alabama native, Marriott teaches worship courses and oversees a diverse range of musical activities associated with the worship and ministry life of the Seminary community. These include directing the Seminary's *Laudamus* choir and the St. Louis Lutheran Chorale, formerly known as *Pro Musica Sacra*, as well as serving as organist-in-residence. He joined Concordia Seminary in the 2015-16 academic year as director of Music Arts. He was installed as the Kreft Chair for Music Arts in 2017.


Holding undergraduate and graduate degrees in music from Concordia University, Nebraska, Seward, and Concordia University Wisconsin, Mequon, respectively, he received his Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in Liturgical Studies from Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, Ill., with an emphasis in liturgical inculturation. He received his Alternate Route Certificate from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis and was ordained in 2020.

Marriott has served a variety of congregations across the United States, including Trinity Lutheran Church in Lisle, Ill., where he was the director of worship from 2009-15. Previously, he was the director of sanctuary worship at St. John Lutheran Church and School in Rochester, Mich., from 2007-09, and the minister of music at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Jacksonville Beach, Fla., from 2004-07.

He and his wife, Kristi, are blessed with two children, Joel and Kirstin.

Old Testament Lesson

Joel 2:12–19

¹²"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; ¹³and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. ¹⁴Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD your God? ¹⁵Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast; call a solemn assembly; ¹⁶gather the people. Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. Epistle

2 Corinthians 5:20b—6:10

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

¹Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ²For he says,

"In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you."

Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. ³We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; ⁷by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

Matthew 6:1–6, 16–21

¹[Jesus said:] "Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven.

²"Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ³But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

⁵"And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. ¹⁶"And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ¹⁷But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, ¹⁸that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

¹⁹"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, ²⁰but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."




C I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.




- *Lord's Prayer
