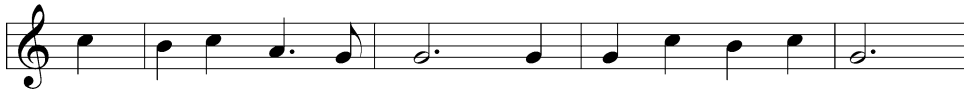

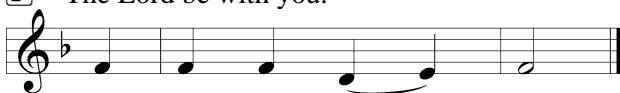

Isaiah 40:21–31

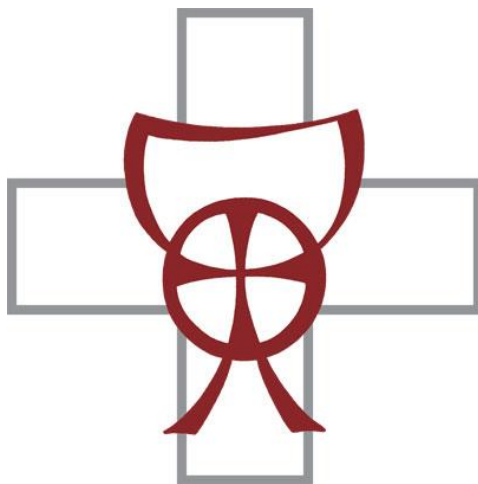

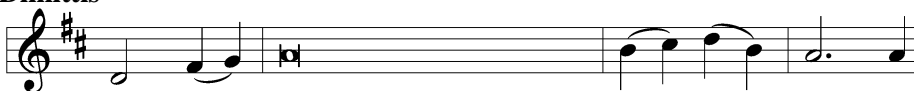

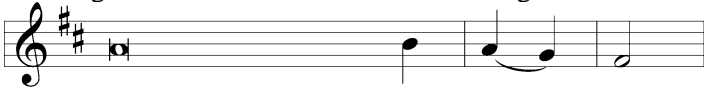
