Bible verse: And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son.

1 John 5:11 For Young Children:

Cleopas and his companion did not immediately recognize Jesus when he met them on the road. Their eyes were opened when Jesus took the bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Through the breaking of the bread, these disciples' eyes were opened. They were no longer sad and hopeless but were filled with great joy.

Christ takes away our spiritual blindness through the Word. The Old and New Testaments both have as their focus Jesus Christ and His suffering, death, and resurrection for our salvation. As Jesus opens the Scriptures for us, our hearts burn within us with a living faith that believes and trusts in Him.

Through hearing the Word and receiving the Lord's Supper, Christ comes to us and abides with us. Through Word and Sacrament, He continues to open our eyes and strengthen us in the one true faith.

Key Point of the Lesson

Easter people. Today is the Third Sunday of Easter. And it's another day to share the Easter message of our resurrected Savior, Jesus Christ.

Apps can be games to play or an app can help us find our way to a special location, remind us of what we have to do, show us the weather or give us a weather forecast, help us research a problem, or watch a movie. You can read or listen to music on a device. These devices can be an expert that goes with you. On my device I even have the Bible. I can read the Bible or listen to it.

In today's Gospel reading, two sad men were walking to Emmaus and were talking about all the things they heard had happened in Jerusalem that very day. The two men were puzzled. They could have used an app to help them understand why Jesus had to suffer and die, or an app to locate His body. But they didn't have any research tool. Instead their help came from a Stranger who came and walked with them.

The Stranger asked why the men were so sad. Then He said, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into His glory?" (Luke 24:25-26). Necessary, really? Then that Stranger began to teach using the Word of God. He explained from the Word of God just why Jesus had to die and then rise.

Later, in Emmaus, when the two men ate with the Stranger, they saw their Guest break the bread. At that very moment, right then, they knew who He was. It was Jesus Himself who had turned their sadness to gladness, who had been with them in their sorrow and taught them God's Word. When you wonder about Jesus, go to the Scriptures. Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you God's Word.

New apps come out all the time. Some of your favorites will go away. But do not replace God's Word. Keep reading the Bible. You can always trust the Bible because "the Word of the Lord remains forever" (1 Peter 1:25). And as you read know that the Holy Spirit will be with you.


